

Financial empowerment of female headed households by improving their livelihoods of Handloom making

• No. of Beneficiaries: Three (03) groups of female Headed HHs (38

individuals)

Handloom making is the main livelihood of the identified beneficiaries. This livelihood was disturbed since COVID 19 period. They do not have the capacity to buy raw materials for the production. These beneficiaries are being paid only for the labor cost by the handloom dealers who gave threads along with orders.

Intervention by the OR

- Threads were provided to restart their livelihoods which are collapsed since 2020 (COVID period).
- ➤ Awareness on basic financial management and book keeping were provided by resource person.
- ➤ Awareness of value addition and production of quality products were provide.
- ➤ Links with buyers to sell the products and material suppliers were established
